TIME CONTROL:

The time control is 90 minutes for the first 40 moves, followed by 30 minutes for the rest of the game, with a 30-second increment starting from move one..

Recording of moves is obligatory for the entire duration of the game.

Default time is 30 minutes, players arriving later will be forfeited unless Chief arbiter decides otherwise.

- 2. Sonneborn-Berger system
- 3. Koya System
- 4. Number of wins

APPEALS PROCEDURE:

Protests against the Chief Arbiter`s decisions must be submitted in written form to the Tournament Director within thirty (30) minutes after the completion of the playing session. The appeal has to be submitted by the player. The appeal must be accompanied by the sum of 100 € as a deposit from the signatory. If the appeal is upheld, the sum shall be returned immediately. If the appeal is refused, the deposit will be forfeited to Organizers. The Appeals Committee`s decisions are final.

ABOUT PIRAEUS:

Piraeus is located 12 km away from Athens city center and bears great significance as a commercial and political center. In fact, the port of Piraeus dates back to antiquity and was established around the 5th century BC. The largest port of the eastern Mediterranean is the gateway to so many Greek islands, but Piraeus also has a secret side that will grow on you the more explore. Exploring the coast and lively side streets, you will find seafood restaurants and bars with an island feel, pockets of neoclassical buildings and spice-filled bazaars. Piraeus is not just a bustling port but an intriguing destination in its own right, inviting visitors to explore its markets, bars, squares, yacht marinas and gourmet restaurants, as well as the local hangouts where impromptu bouzouki evenings bring back the spirit of the fifties and sixties. The largest of three natural bays, Athens' port houses a cruise liner terminal as well as docks for ferries carrying passengers to all sorts of Greek islands. And just around the coast, the atmosphere changes in the charming seaside neighborhoods of Microlimano and Pasalimani, with pockets of neoclassical buildings, bars and excellent seafood tavernas. HISTORY OF PEIRAIKOS SYNDESMOS:

Peiraikos Syndesmos was founded on October 22, 1894 as a "MUSIC - GYMNASTICS ASSOCIATION", by a group of proprogressive Piraeus citizens.

Its establishment, as well the organization of similar associations (Panhellenic General Assembly, National General

Assembly), was due to an essential historical necessity, which aimed at the development of the relevant infrastructure, in order for our homeland to be able to undertake the organization of first Olympic Games of 1896.

In the first period, the Association ran a Steering Committee, which bore the title COSMETIA and whose members were elected from among themselves by lot. In 1898, the Board of Directors was established by statute, and the late Nikolaos Filon was elected first President.

In the course of time, the then newly founded Association, thanks to the voluntary and selfless contribution of its members, was formed into a multifaceted Organization with public benefit activities in the field of Letters, Art, Sports and Culture.
